Dear Parent or Guardian,

The University Interscholastic League (UIL) has randomly selected and tested your child for anabolic steroids as mandated by Senate Bill 8, passed by the 80th Texas Legislature. UIL representatives selected students' names at random from a list of AHS student athletes. Test results will be *confidentially* reported to limited school personnel and the students' parents in a few weeks.

In preparation for the UIL Anabolic Steroid Testing Program and as a condition of participation in UIL sports, AISD student athletes and their parents signed an agreement and release to allow this testing. Failure to do so precludes participation in any UIL competition.

Statewide, SB 8 requires that:

UIL will test a statistically significant number of student-athletes in grades 9-12 at approximately 30% of UIL member high schools. The selection process of schools and student-athletes is random, and approximately 40,000-50,000 student athletes will be tested for anabolic steroids between this spring and the end of the 2008-09 school year. All testing dates are unannounced, in keeping with the nature of the random steroid testing process.
